Regional participants complete training in laws consolidation

ANGUILLA—The Regional Law Revision Centre hosted a Consolidation of Laws training last week at Hannah-Waiver House. Participating in the programme were persons from the Attorneys General Chambers of Guyana, Cayman Islands, Antigua and Barbuda and Anguilla.

The programme provided participants with an in-depth understanding of the Consolidation cycle, its impact on the Chambers, and various techniques in successfully managing this cycle. Consolidation is a continuous process of compiling all amending laws over the years

into a principal legislation for ease of reference. The course facilitator was Yolande Dash.

The programme concluded on Friday, March 28, with a brief certificate presentation ceremony. In attendance were Chief Minister Hubert Hughes, Attorney-General James Wood and other invited guests.

The Consolidation training programme, which commenced in 2009, now forms part of the Centre's annual schedule of activities. Over the years, participants from fifteen Caribbean islands, and others, some from as far away as The Falkland Islands, have

travelled to Anguilla to participate in this programme.

The Regional Law Revision Centre Inc. was established in 2007 in Anguilla as a non-profit organisation as a result of the collaborative efforts of Anguilla, Montserrat, the Turks and Caicos Islands, and Department for International Development (DFID), UK and Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO). The Centre was established to maintain regular publication of accurate and accessible laws for the Overseas Territories of Montserrat, Anguilla, Turks & Caicos Islands and other Caribbean States.
