Anguilla hosts lawyers for Law Consolidation

ANGUILLA—The Regional Law Revision Centre in Anguilla hosted a Consolidation of Laws training programme for participants from Attorney Generals Chambers of five Overseas Territories. Participants came from as far away as Falkland Islands, as well as Belize, Turks and Caicos Islands, Tortola and Anguilla.

The course instructor was Yolande Dash who is a legislative publisher with vast experience and knowledge in law consolidation and revision. The course provided a comprehensive training with an in-depth understanding of the consolidation cycle, its

impact on the Chambers and the techniques in successful management. Consolidation is a continuous process of compiling all amending laws over the years into a principal legislation for ease of reference.

The Law Revision Centre in Anguilla was established in 2007 in order to maintain regular publication of accurate and accessible laws for the Overseas Territories of Montserrat, Anguilla, the Turks and Caicos Islands and other Caribbean states.

At the end of the course, certificates were presented to the five participants. Dash

said that consolidation of laws is important for every country and the exercise will benefit the participants and their respective chambers. She thanked the representatives from overseas and the staff of the Anguilla Attorney General's Chambers as well as the Law Revision Staff and the IT Department.
