Four Attend Law Revision Training In Anguilla

The fourth training programme at the Regional Law Revision Centre in Anguilla has now been carried out with participants from the British Virgin Islands, Barbados and Dominica.

At the end of the two-day training on Friday, May 27, Trainer for the programme, Yolande Dash, noted that the programme was gaining a lot of popularity throughout the Caribbean. She said the recently-held course covered Consolidation of Laws.

"I know the participants have learnt a lot during the programme and will carry that information with them to the various Attorneys General Chambers, and make this programme well-known to other perspective participants in the Caribbean," she stated.

The Certificates of Participation were presented by Governor Alistair Harrison. "I think the consolidation of laws is particularly an important issue for lawyers and laymen alike," he observed. "I was always told, at the time when I was considering a law degree, that the great thing about the law is that it is dynamic, constantly changing, constantly being developed. And that Parliaments/Houses of Assembly, or whatever, have an irritating habit of instead of simply repealing laws and starting with a fresh slate, of amending existing laws; and therefore the consolidation into a coherent and understandable whole, is an absolutely vital task."

Those to whom the Governor presented the certificates were Fikile Dlamini and Desary Cameron-McDowell of the British Virgin Islands; Rolanda Williams of Barbados; and Pearl Richards of Dominica.

Governor Harrison commented afterwards: "It is very good that we have participation from two independent jurisdictions as well as the BVI. I welcome all participants. I hope that there will be broader participation from around the region. Thanks to everybody who was concerned in this course and I look forward to the next occasion."
