

SIX TRAINED AT LAW REVISION CENTRE IN ANGUILLA

The Regional Law Revision Centre in Anguilla is continuing to train a number of persons as part of its Consolidation of Laws Training Programme.

The latest training, conducted by Ms Yolande Dash, was held at the Centre's offices, at Hannah-Waver House, on March 27 and 28. The participants were Michelle Daley of the Attorney General's Chambers in Anguilla; Eusvon Brooks and Travis Reddock, staff members of the Regional Law Revision Centre; Susan Jarvis of the Ministry of Legal Affairs and the Attorney General's Chambers in Antigua; Maureen Benjamin of the Attorney General's Chambers in the Cayman Islands; and Mark Anthony Mahabir of the Ministry of Legal

Affairs and the Attorney General's Chambers in Guyana.

The participants were presented with certificates on Friday, March 28, by Chief Minister Hubert Hughes. In attendance also were Attorney General James Wood and other invited guests.

The programme provided participants with an in-depth understanding of the Consolidation Cycle, its impact on the Chambers and explored various techniques in successfully managing the Cycle. Consolidation is a continuous process of compiling all amending laws over the years into a principal legislation for ease of reference.

The training programme, which commenced in 2009, now forms part of the Centre's annual schedule

of activities. Over the years participants from fifteen Caribbean islands, and as far as the Falkland Islands, have travelled to Anguilla to participate in the programme.

The Regional Law Revision Centre Inc was established in 2007 in Anguilla as a non-profit organisation as a result of the collaborative efforts of Anguilla, Montserrat, the Turks and Caicos Islands, the Cayman Islands, the Department for International Development and the Foreign and Commonwealth Office.

The Centre was established to maintain regular publication of accurate and accessible laws for the Overseas Territories of Montserrat, Anguilla and Turks and Caicos Islands; and other Caribbean States.
